Alabama State University was founded in 1867 by nine former slaves. It began as the Lincoln School in Marion, Ala., and moved to Montgomery, Ala., in 1887, where it was established as a leading producer of African-American teachers.

Alabama State University has experienced tremendous growth, both physically and academically, since its humble beginnings. Multi-million dollar buildings now grace the 395-acre campus. High-demand programs have been established and cutting-edge research is being conducted by ASU faculty and students.

With a focus on a global initiative, the campus has a more diverse population while maintaining its proud heritage as a Historically Black College and University (HBCU). 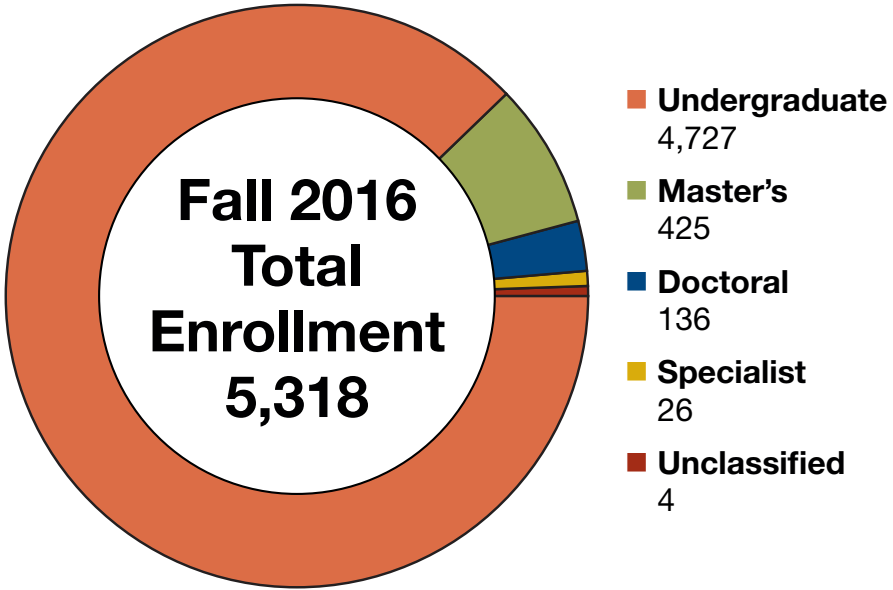

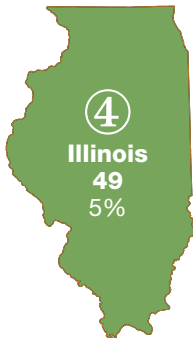
